Windy’s Lifetime Accomplishments:

- 2007 National Open Field Champion run by an Amateur
- Qualified for 15 Nationals, a Finalist 7 times
- Doubl Header Winner March 2012
- 163 All-Age career points with an almost even split between
- Amateur and Open stakes: 79.5 Open - 83.5 Amateur
- 11 Open Wins - 12 Amateur Wins
- 55 Open Finishes - 58 Amateur Finishes
- 29 Derby Points
- 159.5 of her All Age points were with an Amateur handler.
- Fall of 2013 she won the Amateur in the last trial that she entered at the age of 12.2 years old.
- At 12 years old she was qualified for both the 2013 National Open and the 2014 National Amateur
- She entered the 2013 National Open in Cheraw, SC and retired after picking up the flyer in the first series, and it was won by her offspring, 2014 NAFC-FC Texas Troubador “Tubb”
- “Windy” whelped 4 litters for a total of 27 pups
- 20 of her offspring are Qualified All-Age, 4 are titled, 3 have run in National Championship Stakes and 1 has won the National Amateur Stake
- Of her 27 offspring, 25 have accumulated the following: (As of 12/11/14) 230 Derby Points, 60.5 Open and 142.0 Amateur All Age Points. They have finished 81 Open Stakes, 127 Amateur Stakes, 82 Quals, 164 Derby Stakes and 30 Master Passes
- It has been 29 years since a NFC female has had an offspring also win a National Stake
- Ranked 5th Open Dog in 2007
- Ranked 6th Amateur Dog in 2007
- Ranked 4th Amateur Dog in 2010
- Ranked 10th Amateur Dog in 2012

“Windy” was a very special gal.... she slept in our bed every night, looked forward to meal time as much as going to the line at a trial. She was a wonderful mother to her pups and had unbridled enthusiasm for everything in her life. We look forward to her legacy living on through her pups and their progeny.
